

Growling grass frog sighted at Ecolinc

Ecolinc's logo, the growling grass frog was spotted basking in the sun in the Ecolinc wetland this morning. Excited Ecolinc staff and visiting students from Overnewton College, Mac Robertson Girls High School and Oberon High School were the first to observe this vulnerable species in the wetland. The Ecolinc wetland has been established for less than three years yet supports a wide range of flora and fauna including four frog species; the pobblebonk *Limnodynastes dumerili*, common froglet *Crinia signifera*, spotted marsh frog *Limnodynastes tasmaniensis* and the growling grass frog *Litoria raniformis*. This discovery supports our very popular wetland program 'What's Growling in the Wetland?'

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Ecolinc will conduct a **Primary Science teachers' PD program on Tuesday 4 December** designed to equip teachers with knowledge, skills and classroom strategies linked to 'Environmental Sustainability'. Total cost including morning/afternoon tea and lunch is \$55 per teacher.

Ecolinc will also conduct a **VCE Science Professional Development program in December**. This year teachers can choose to attend on either **Thursday 6 or Friday 7 December 2007**. The program will cater for teachers of VCE Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science and Physics. All VCE Science study designs will be reviewed, particularly the new VCE Year 12 Chemistry course, with hands on Ecolinc SAC tasks available for teachers to sample. Total cost including morning/afternoon tea and lunch is \$55 per teacher per day.
